Excerpts from an address by the cardinals of the church to Pope Pius III which is preserved in the National Library of Paris, Vol. 2, p. 650-651: Quote: 'Of all the advice that we can offer your holiness we must open your eyes well and use all possible forse in the matter namely, to permit the reading of the gospel as little as possible in all the countries under your jurisdiction. Let the very little part of the gospel which is usually read in mass, and let no one be permitted to read it more. So long as people will be content with the small amount your interest will prosper; but as the people want to read it more your interest will begin to fail. The Bible is the book which more than anything has raised against us the tumults and tempests by which we have almost perished. In fact, if one compares the teachings of the Bible with what takes place in our churches, he will soon find discord and will realize that our teachings are often different from the Bible and often still contrary to it.'"
